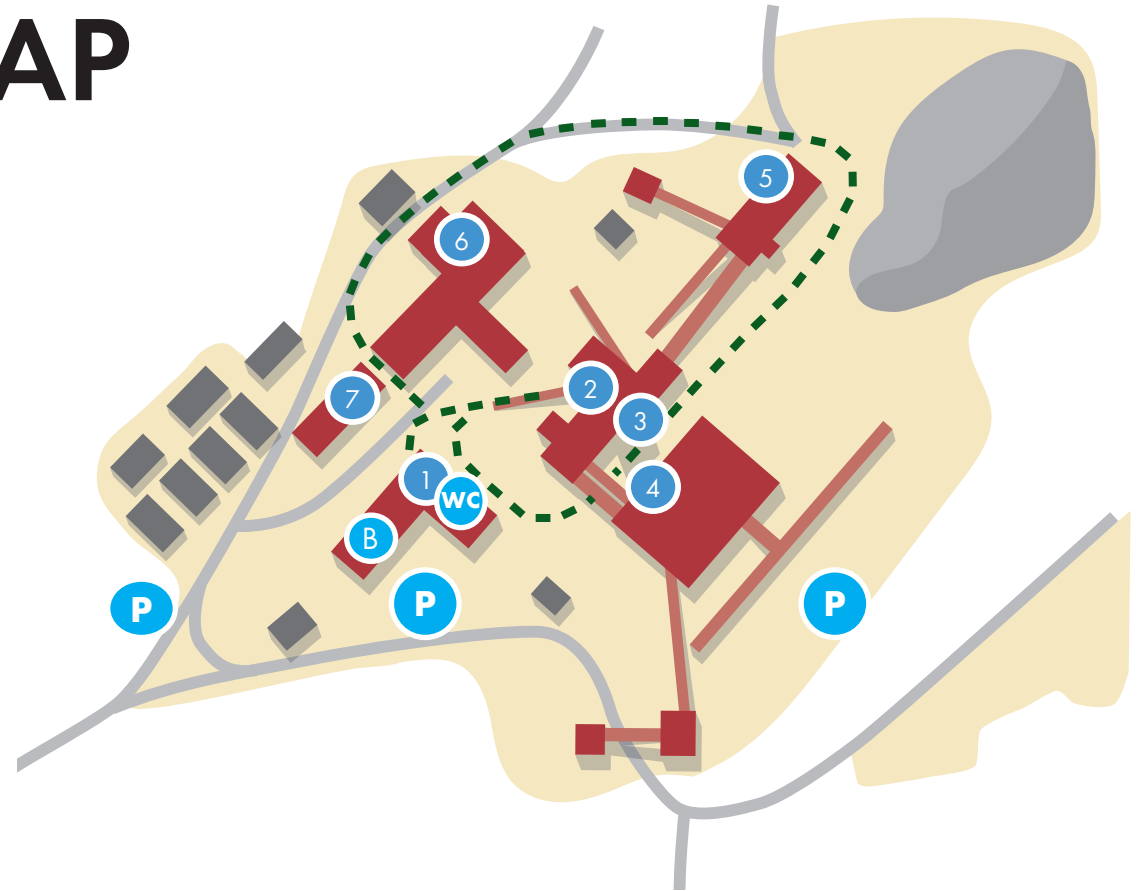


FOLLOW THE MAP

- 1 VISITOR CENTRE.** Information and has an exhibition about the history of Stripa and lots of equipment from when the mine was in operation.
- 2 THE MINE HEADFRAME.** (Built in 1937-1938). The 31 meters high mine headframe is located just above the main shaft leading to the mine where iron ore was mined at several levels. The mine headframe is constructed in order to be able to accommodate the large ore containers, so-called tap or chute bunkers of silos.
- 3 THE GRADING PLANT.** (Built in 1938). The southern grading plant was the first stop for iron ore when it was hauled up to the surface. The ore was crushed and graded in order to simplify the dressing process for the various grades of ore. The southern grading plant was also the last station for the unfinished iron.
- 4 THE DRESSING PLANT.** (Built in 1942). In the dressing plant the iron ore was crushed and milled down to fine material or iron-ore concentrate where the high Fe content iron could be separated from the rock particles or tailings. The principle is the same as that used in gold washing but on a larger scale.
- 5 THE NORTHERN GRADING PLANT.** (Built in 1938). The northern grading plant was Stripa's big grading plant. Here rock tailings were separated from iron ore and magnetic material from non-magnetic material. The ore was sorted by hand on a conveyor belt. This work was primarily done by women. It has been calculated that a worker lifted many tons of stone per day on average.
- 6 THE HOIST HOUSE.** (Built in 1907). The hoist house had an engine room and a control room for two mining hoists: one for raising ore and the other for workers and equipment. In airspace between the hoist house and the mine headframe we can see lines connecting the elevators with the hoists.
- 7 THE FORGE SHOP.** (Built in 1907). The forge shop repaired the miner's drills and boring bits. The rock in Stripa was tough and this took its toll on the drills. In order to be able to do the job well a miner needed a drill station that amounted to about 100 drills during a work shift.
